25 INMATES ARE RELEASED IN 2016

During the period from January till July 2016, a large numbers of inmates were released from the Kanater Prison in Cairo. However, many of them are now facing insecurity and hardship after they were deported back to the

About the Prisoners

El Kanater Prison Fellowship men's group comprises inmates from different nationalities.

They have been imprisoned under a variety of criminal charges, and sometimes simply because they do not have a visa. Many struggle to obtain legal counsel and advocate for themselves because of language barriers and corruption in the justice system.

Prison Fellowship Program

The Prison Fellowship conducts 3 meetings on a weekly basis. Sundays are ceremony and worship, Tuesdays are Bible Studies and reflections on spiritual books, and Thursdays are Life Group Meeting and sharing of testimonies. Saturdays include small prayer time while main topics discussion involve management of the Fellowship program and the Help Ministry which supports other prisoners.

Prisoners' Challenges

Embassies should provide support and advice to any national who gets into difficulty in a foreign country, but unfortunately such action is not initiated in most cases. Prisoners with long sentences might feel that their life is over, especially those who have no families or friends to care for them.

Activities of our Prison Ministry include:

- Engaging and training new volunteers in the prison ministry.
- Increasing community understanding of the social teachings of the Church's as we reach out to the prisoners with God's Grace and Love.
- Conducting weekly visits to the inmates in the Kanater Prison.
- Providing direct pastoral and counseling support to the inmates.
- Sharing the Gospel and give empathetic listening ear that embodies love, care and a non-judgmental attitude.
- Providing inmates during our weekly visits with food, clothing, shelter, medical care, Bibles, and meaningful work adequate to their conditions.
- Providing support and maintain follow up for the released inmates.
- Promoting a wide variety of leather, metal, and wood craft items, made by inmates of the Kanater Prison.

- Supporting inmates with mental or physical health problems to help them access the services they need, in prison and after release.
- Communicating inmates' needs in the prison and raise it to official authorities whenever we can.
- Providing support and maintain follow up for the released inmates.
- Helping spread the Good News of God's love and promise of salvation.

Twice a year during Christmas and Easter, the authorities allows Bishop Mouneer and a group from the Diocese to meet with all of the Christian prisoners as a group. Together we sing songs, pray, hear the Word of God and celebrate the Lord's Supper together.

About the Prison Ministry Team

Current Challenges

To love and walk with the inmates through challenging times, is the heart of our Prison Ministry's mission. The Prison ministry team has been considering how best to meet the challenges of supporting prisoners' materialistic, emotional and spiritual needs. Not just passing time by in the prison, we step in by reaching out to the prisoners and encouraging them in God's love and grace that makes a significant impact on their lives.

On a weekly basis, members from the Diocese of Egypt and volunteers visit primarily foreign inmates at El Kanater Prison on the outskirts of Cairo.

Prisoners who encountered many setbacks and pain in the past, now have the hope to make a difference in the future, achieve new goals and tackle challenges courageously. Unfortunately, most prisoners do not have a valid travel document and they must pay for the fee for the travel document issuance, as well as for the flight tickets in order to be released.

Therefore, with God's grace and people's generosity, we need a total of 77,897 L.E (8,777 USD)

including 45,000 L.E (5,067 USD) from the total amount to support the prisoners in obtaining a valid passport and air tickets before deportation can be arranged.

The Financial Report records a total expenses of 124,300 L.E(14.004 USD) in the Prison Ministry Budget from the period January - July 2016.

Thanks to God and to the donors generous support, we succeeded to cover 91,403 L.E. from the total expenses and still need 32,897 L.E to cover for the remaining expenses.

Also, 45,000 L.E (5,067 USD) is needed for the Air Tickets. A total of 77,897 L.E. (8,777 USD) to cover all expenses including air tickets.
